The EuroBioBlitz is back!

EuroBioBlitz is a Europe-wide wildlife recording event taking place on the 29th and 30th of September 2023. Anyone across the continent can support ecological research by uploading photos of their local wildlife to the iNaturalist app.

How to take part: You can take part as an individual, by simply uploading photos of your local wildlife that you see on the 29th and 30th of September to the free iNaturalist app. Alternatively, you could go that one step further by organising a walk to help your local community, friends or colleagues to discover the wildlife that's on their doorstep. To receive free information, guidance, and resources to help you along the way, head to www.bnhc.org.uk/eurobioblitz-2023 where the Natural History Consortium will be able to support you to run your own mini wildlife-recording event during EuroBioBlitz 2023. This could range from a 20-min walk using the iNaturalist app to record the wildlife that you see around your workplace, to a full-day BioBlitz event with activities like pond-dipping and expert-led guided walks – you decide!
